





Tiger — 1926, 1938, 1950, 1962, 1974, 1986, 1998, 2010, 2022 Tigers are brave and strong. They like excitement.





Rooster — 1933, 1945, 1957, 1969, 1981, 1993, 2005, 2017, 2029 Roosters are good workers. They have lots of friends.





















Crossword: Nature





Many people like to play Sudoku. It is a number puzzle.


Start with an easy Sudoku


