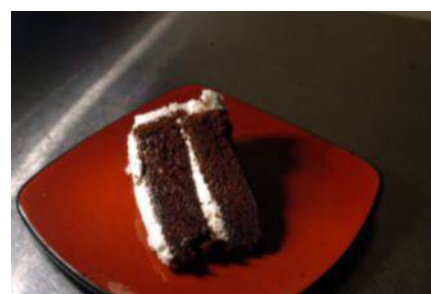

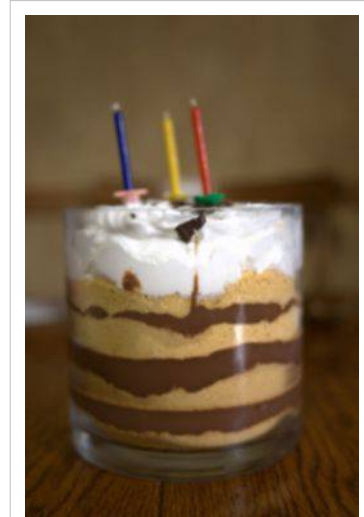

In New Mexico and southern Colorado, panocha is a pudding made from ground sprouted wheat and *piloncillo*.



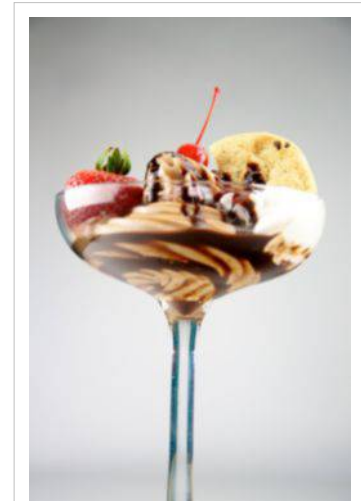
