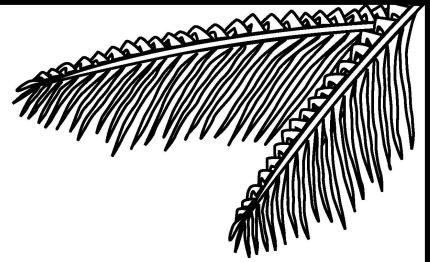


ANIMAL SKINS

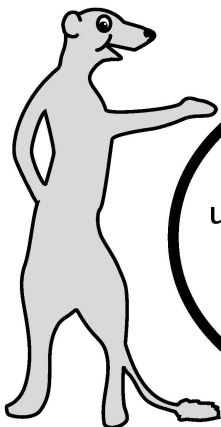
