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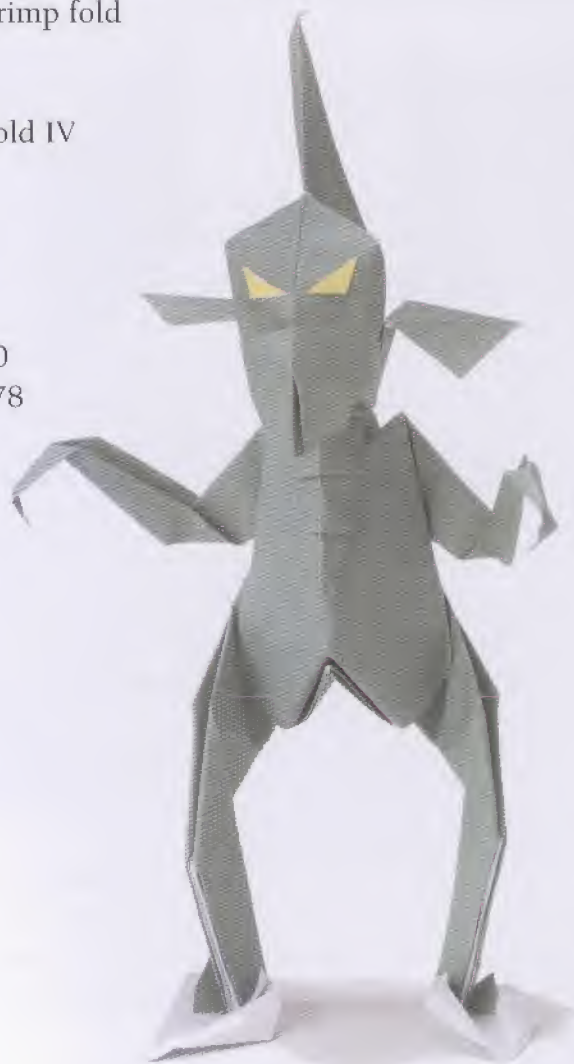
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Preface

Years ago, when I first began to fold origami, I would look again and again at the instructions given in my borrowed book, trying to learn even the simplest folds. But I also looked ahead, studying the diagram showing the next step of whatever project I was folding, to see how it should look after the fold. As it turned out, looking ahead at the next step, the result of a fold, is a very good way for a beginner to

learn origami. You will easily pick up this learning technique and many others as you follow the step-by-step directions given here for creating a menagerie of menacing monsters. So sit down, select some squares of paper, and discover the enjoyment of bringing creatures of horror from books and movies to new life in your hands.

Basic Instructions

Paper: Paper used in traditional origami is thin, keeps a crease well, and folds flat. Packets of specially designed sheets, from 5 to 8 inches (13 to 21 cm) square, are available in various colors. You can also use plain white, solid-color, even wrapping paper with a design on only one side, and cut the paper to size. Be aware, though, that some papers stretch slightly in length or width, which can cause folding problems, while others tear easily.

Beginners or those concerned about working with smaller tight folds can also use larger paper sizes. While regular paper may be a bit heavy to allow the many tight folds used in creating small traditional origami figures, it is fine for practicing or working on larger projects.

Use same-size squares for working the multi-part figures in this book, unless other dimensions are provided.

Technique: Make each fold with care. Position the paper precisely, especially at the corners, and line the edges up before creasing. Once you are sure of the fold, use a fingernail to make a clean, flat crease.

For more complex folds, create “construction lines.” Fold and unfold, using simple mountain and valley folds, to pre-crease. This creates guidelines, and the finished fold is more likely to match the one shown in the book. At this stage, folds that look different, because the angles aren’t quite right, can throw you off. Don’t get discouraged with your first efforts. In time, what your mind can create, your fingers can fashion.

Creativity: Once you are confident in your folding ability, try adjusting certain folds to shape each figure more to your liking. An arm reaching out, a threatening step forward, and your paper creature springs to chilling life.

Do add color and detail, too. Feel free to use markers, glue on bits and folds of paper, add props, and do whatever you like to make each figure special.

Base Folds

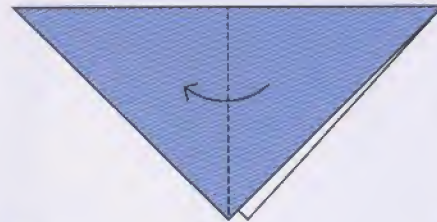
Base folds are basic forms that do not in themselves produce origami, but serve as a basis, or jumping-off point, for a number of creative origami figures—some quite complex. As when beginning other crafts, learning to fold these base folds is not the most exciting part of origami. They are, however, easy to do, and will help you with your technique. They also quickly become rote, so much so that you can do many using different-colored papers while you are watching television or your mind is elsewhere. With completed base folds handy, if you want to quickly work up a form or are suddenly inspired with an idea for an original, unique figure, you can select an appropriate base fold and swiftly bring a new creation to life.
